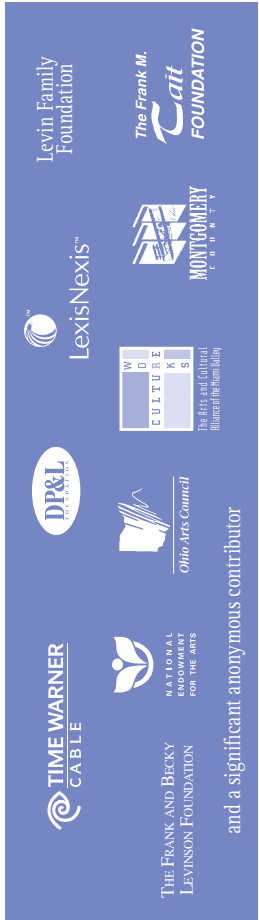

Week 1, June 22-26

From Photo to Drawing...Faces and Places!

Create large pixilated drawings and paintings in the style of artist Chuck Close. Young artists will also get a chance to draw and paint outside using a variety of materials to create landscapes for a portion of the day.
