Week 1, June 21–25 **Sculpture and Body-Casting**

The body is interesting to study, but especially when you can create your own model! Create a cast of your own body using plaster and recreate your insides using a variety of materials. Paint and display your body cast sculpture! Also, learn anatomy drawing. This workshop even aligns to Ohio state standards in science.

Week 2, June 28 –July 2 **Painting: From Rembrandt to Graffiti Art**

Art was once a major method for capturing history. Children will learn the connections to art history and today's more abstract art forms. Learn the style of master painters and the basics of acrylic painting, including color theory and techniques. Also, create a wild spray paint painting while learning about the contemporary art of graffiti.

Week 3, July 5–9 **Glass Firing and Wire Sculpture**

Alexander Calder, the inventor of the mobile and a great kinetic artist, is the inspiration for this workshop. Learn the art of glass firing; create beads and small glass sculptures. Incorporate your glass art in wire sculptures inspired by artist Alexander Calder. Display your sculpture design sketches alongside finished sculptures.

Week 4, July 12–16 **Sound Sculptures and Music-Inspired Large-Scale Painting**

Music and visual art are great partners in the real world! You can learn to create your own "visual music"! Design and create your very own sound sculpture. Learn techniques to create specific sounds and craft your sculpture to make beautiful music. Also, create a large-scale painting inspired by music. This class will fuse music and art to make a great art and music-making experience.

Week 5, July 19–July 23 **Sketchbook Design and Portfolio Development**

The development of a portfolio is one of the most important skills that any young artist can develop. Learn how to create and keep a sketchbook, an important visual tool for every artist. You will also develop an artist's portfolio using a variety of mediums. At the end of the week each artist will get a chance to have his or her portfolio critiqued by local college professors and artists.

Week 6, July 26–July 30 **Foam Sculpture Mosaics**

Working on a team is one of the most important skills needed in the workplace today! Work on a large-scale collaborative foam sculpture with fellow campers and learn mosaic as a finishing touch. They will create a masterpiece on the potter's wheel and hand build Egyptian hieroglyphic tiles. Create pharaoh paper pulp sculptures or Cleopatra's bust! Glaze and fire all pottery pieces to take home!

Week 5, July 19-23 **Mosaic Animals and Painting**

The beauty and endurance of mosaics will provide the basis for this session with an artist who appreciates this unique art form! A whole new world of art will become available to your child! Using the technique of mosaic, create a large-scale animal out of luan board and cover with materials ranging from glass to metal. Also, create a painting for your animal to live in!

Week 6 August 9-13 **Plaster Casting: Famous Self-Portrait Paintings**

Children will become familiar with the work of the old masters of portraiture. They will then choose a favorite painting from the master's and cast your own face out of plaster. Try to replicate the painting while adding your own new designs. Finished pieces will be plaster cast relief self portraits-bringing a master painting to new life! And what a great way to learn history!
